Old friends back in 'Peanuts Movie'

Film true to comic strip's warmth and humor

"The Peanuts Movie," which opens nationally on Friday, is the one movie this year that will have you exclaiming "Good grief" in the best possible way.

The film, which revisits the classic beloved comic strip characters created by Charles M. Schulz — including Charlie Brown, his dog Snoopy and best friend Linus, and Linus' opinionated sister, Lucy, among a host of others — brings to the silver screen all of the warmth and humor of the original newspaper strip and the classic television specials of the 1960s.

While Charlie Brown and his friends have made it to the big screen previously in four other feature films, most notably "A Boy Named Charlie Brown" from 1969, this new film feels like the perfect continuation of the familiar "Peanuts" characters that first appeared in animated form in the TV specials "A Charlie Brown Christmas" (1965) and "It's the Great Pumpkin, Charlie Brown" (1966).

The voices in "The Peanuts Movie" are dead ringers for the voices from those TV specials, which are the blueprint for every small- or large-screen production of the "Peanuts" characters. The music in-

cludes new recordings of classic Vince Guaraldi-composed "Christmas Time is Here" and "Lucy and Linus," along with some newer music as well, all of which will elicit fond memories of childhood in many adults in the audience.

The plot also treads on the familiar ground of Charlie Brown's desire to fit in with his gang of friends, as well as his infatuation with the red-headed girl who moves into his neighborhood and steals his heart.

Helmed by Craig Schulz, son of Charles M. Schulz, "The Peanuts Movie" always stays true to the simple humor of childhood experiences, with a sly adult world view that Charles M. Schulz evoked in all of his famous comic strips
